Neon signs, old gas stations and bucolic scenery await you, so bring your car and some friends and experience the "Mother Road". Only \$5 and you also recieve a color guide and map to help navigate each of the driving tour routes!

6 THINGS YOU CAN'T SEE ANYWHERE ELSE (bus tours)

We know it's really fun to drive your own Buick and we encourage you to explore the area on our own, but sometimes it's nice to just sit back in an air-conditioned comfy seat and let someone else do the driving. Because of distance or big-city navigation, we are offering three bus tours — each one unique and interesting:

- Oklahoma City: It's only a short drive away, but might be much more relaxing for a bus to drive you from spot to spot in this major city. Visit the beautiful and very memorable National Memorial and Museum, which honors the victims, survivors, rescuers and all who were affected by the Oklahoma City bombing on April 19, 1995. Tour the historic Automobile Alley district, which contains numerous heritage buildings that were once home to prestigious automobile dealerships. Lunch will be served in the historic Buick Building. This tour will be offered on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.
- Bud's Auto Salvage and 1894 Sod House and Museum: Thursday's tour is designed for anyone who loves history and old cars and it's truly a unique opportunity! Take a bus ride for the 2+ hour drive north to Aline, OK. Bud's Auto Salvage has one of the largest (60 acres!) selections of cars, trucks and parts in the midwest (read about Bud's Salvage in the March 2016 Bugle). Lunch will be served by the local women. Afterwards, tour Aline's original 1984 Sod House and Museum, which has exhibits, artifacts, photographs and a root cellar portraying the daily activities of the early-day pioneers.
- Annual Modernism Festival: This weekend festival in Oklahoma City celebrates mid-century furniture, fashion and accessories. It is a very popular event every year, and we are fortunate that it falls on our BCA National Meet weekend. Learn more about this period by attending the Friday evening Modernism Mod Market Preview, Fashion Show and Lecture and take a separate trip to attend the Modernism Festival on Saturday morning. Both events are held in the St. Patrick's Catholic Church.



Where to stay?

If you are planning to come to the 2019 National Meet in Oklahoma, the first thing you should do is make hotel reservations! Although there are plenty of alternative hotels in Midwest City, our host hotel is the Sheraton Midwest City Hotel at the Reed Conference Center. The hotel's Emerald Restaurant is open for all-day dining (6:30 AM - 11 PM), features a full bar, and room service (during limited hours). A complimentary full breakfast buffet is offered to BCA members who are registered at the hotel. There is also an outdoor courtyard, outdoor walking/jogging path, indoor heated pool/spa and a 24-hour fitness center. Plasma TV with premium channels, wireless WiFi internet, pillowtop mattress and much more is included in each room. Additionally the hotel has complimentary self-parking and airport transportation (for an extra charge).

The BCA show field will be held on a nearby parking lot. All meetings and Saturday's BCA banquet will be held at the Reed Conference Center, so the Sheraton is a very convenient place to stay when you are at the 2019 BCA national meet. There are many nearby restuarants and other activities of interest in Midwest City so we hope you will explore the town while you are at the meet. 




Historic Guthrie Tour


This is your chance to travel the old historic Route 66, which goes through Oklahoma. Start in Edmond, only 10 miles north of Oklahoma City and end in Bristow






Bud's Salvage & 1894 Sod House

The grounds include an additional building displaying horse-drawn equipment and period farm implements. For a thorough review and 64 photos, search on YELP for Sod House near Aline, OK. Lunch is included during this unique tour day.





BRICKTOWN

What was once a warehouse neighborhood has been restored, becoming the destination for people looking for fun and entertainment. Stroll along the pedestrian canal, enjoy live music, cheer on a favorite sports team, sit down for a great meal or dance the night away. You can easily spend an afternoon exploring it all. There are far too many things to do in Bricktown to list here, we will focus only on a few.

- Water taxi Cruise the mile-long Bricktown Canal on a water taxi. The 40-minute trip is a relaxed way to tour through Bricktown, from the eastern edge of downtown all the way to the northern edge of the Oklahoma River.
- · American Banjo Museum history of the banjo with more than 300 instruments. Be sure to play the banjos before you leave.
- · Brickopolis family-friendly miniature golf, laser tag, and arcade games
- Harkins Cinemas 16 modern multiplex chain showing blockbuster movies
- Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark ballgames!



unassigned lands of Oklahoma Territory to stake their claim for free land. Over two million acres in Oklahoma had previously been measured out by the government. To commenorate the 100-year anniversary the largest series of sculptures in the world was built. It consists of 47 statues spread across a distance of 365 feet. All are cast in dark bronze, at one-and-a-half life size. There are 38 people portrayed, 34 horses, three wagons, a cannon, a dog, and a jackrabbit! It is quite a major, remarkable and memorable outdoor exhibit and though the Bricktown water taxis ride by the statues, they are best viewed on foot.
